## **A REPORT ON CONSTITUTION DAY 2023**

### **Objective**

The objective was to celebrate the Constitution Day 2023 and inform the students about the Constitution, its significance and its role in shaping India's identity and governance.

### **Activity done**

A warm welcome to the august gathering was given by Chandresh and Vanshika, both students of CLE.

The program began with the traditional ceremony of invoking the blessings of Almighty by lighting the lamp of knowledge and wisdom, by all the guests and faculty members. Honoring and the felicitation ceremony of the guests was done by Shri Vijay Dheer ji, Prof. A.K. Mitra ji, and Prof. (Dr.) Sanjay Kumar ji, and Mr. B.M.K. Gupta Ji (all top most authorities managing the Institution - ADGIPS).

The celebration followed by the conceptual keynote speech by the Principal, CLE, ADGIPS. In his address to the gathering, he stated that India's Constitution Day, also known as Samvidhan Divas, is celebrated annually on November 26th, to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India on this day in 1949. The word "constitution" comes from the Latin word "constitutio" meaning rules, regulations and orders. Thus, a Constitution is a body of fundamental principles according to which a State is governed. It identifies which institution should exercise powers - and how this should be done. In a democracy, the purpose of the Constitution is to prevent the government from abusing its powers and to ensure that it exercises such power in the proper manner. The Constitution serves as the supreme law of the land, outlining the fundamental rights, duties, and framework of governance for the nation. He also threw a

glimpse on the history of making of the Constitution of India. The recital of the Preamble to the Constitution was done aloud by the gathering.

This was followed by the lecture given by resource person Mr. Atul Kumar Sharma, Hony. Secretary, Delhi Bar Association, Tis Hazari courts, Delhi. Sir addressed the session by informing the students about the Significance of Constitution Day. He emphasized upon the core values and objectives of the Constitution. He stated that Constitution Day is an occasion to reflect on the significance of the Constitution and its role in shaping India's identity and governance. Reaffirmation of fundamental principles: It reiterates India's commitment to justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity, the core values that guide the nation.

Thereafter, the gathering was addressed by Prof. A.K.Mitra ji, Advisor, BBD Group, wherein he shared his vast experience over the practice and execution of law.

The event was followed by a Quiz on the Constitution of India, just to test the knowledge of the audience.

Thereafter an effort to spread awareness about the salient features and Fundamental Rights as enshrined under Article 14, Article 19 (1)(b), and Article 21 A, of the Constitution of India was made through a delightful array of nukkad natak, poetry and group Patriotic dance (mash up) performance highlighting the diversity of India's heritage was given by the students of CLE, ADGIPS.

The session concluded with the announcement of the results of the Poster Making Competition held on 12th Oct. 2023, in the techno Utsav - 3.0 / Jural Utsav - 1.0., followed by the Vote of Thanks given by Prof. (Dr.) Sanjay Kumar, Director, ADGIPS.
